Government's Ebro River Offensive Is Slowed Down

Hendaye, France (At The Spanish Frontier). — (AP) — Spanish insurgents reported today that incessant bombardment by hundreds of warplanes had halted abruptly the government's Ebro river offensive in Catalonia.

The air raiders' curtain of fire was described as so intense that the militiamen were completely disorganized and unable to reform their lines.

Although dispatches from government lines admitted a slight insurgent aerial supremacy, they insisted government planes had been able to minimize the effects of insurgent bombers.

The government's new tactics of striking rapidly first in one sector and then in another forced insurgents to create a mobile reserve in the rear, thus weakening front line defenses.

These shock troops were being moved to a position north of Gandesa — highway junction and insurgent Generalissimo Francisco Franco's former district headquarters 150 miles southwest of Barcelona — to thwart a new menace against the insurgents' left flank which the government reported was ripped open with the capture of the heights of Pobla de Mazaluga.

The taking of that sun-baked hamlet north of Gandesa after fierce fighting yesterday opened the government's way to a score of Matarana river plateau villages.

Observers with insurgent forces described as critical the position of government units in a pocket reached shortly after starting the Ebro campaign 10 days ago. Main passes across the river were said to have been destroyed, making it extremely difficult to bring up supplies.

Another Madison Official Resigns

Madison, Wis. — (Special) — Another appointive Madison city official resigned his post on Tuesday as a result of a recent ruling of the city attorney that no municipal official can transact more than \$300 in business with the city in any one year.

The latest resignation came from Leo Lunenschlos who was a member of the civil service board. He is president of a local bank and an official of a hospital supply concern which sells its products to the city and part-owner of a golf course which the city is renting.

His resignation and that of about eight others who withdrew from city boards and commissions will be considered at the next council meeting August 12.

Rare Fish Caught Near Fond du Lac

Fond du Lac, Wis. — A garfish, an uncommon species in Lake Winnebago waters, was caught by A. E. Ferlund, Milwaukee, early Tuesday. The fish measuring 28 inches in length, was taken off Sandy Beach.

The garfish looks like a swordfish, with long beak-like snout and thin teeth. Belonging to the same family as the flying fish, the garfish is edible, though the bones are green.

According to Harry Chase of Taycheedah, long a resident of the county, Matt Fargo caught the last garfish from the lake many years ago.

Fond du Lac, Wis. — A proposal to stop the raising of foxes and mink within the city limits was presented to the city council in a tentative municipal ordinance Tuesday.

Clerk John E. Murray said that many complaints against raisers of these animals have been received. The proposed ordinance provided that owners of these farms must move them outside the city before Jan. 1 or be subject to jail sentences and fines. The council is expected to pass the ordinance at its next meeting.

Beach Lifeguard Is Drowned While At Potter's Lake

East Troy, Wis. — (UP) — Edward Vopal, 22, beach lifeguard and member of the University of Wisconsin crew, died in knee deep water while swimming at Potter's lake near here yesterday.

Coroner William Best of Walworth county reported the death as an accidental drowning, but said the youth apparently had burst a blood vessel and collapsed in the shallow water after returning from a swim out farther in the lake.

Vopal taking a day off from his duties as lifeguard at Grant Park beach in Milwaukee, was standing in the shallow water near shore when companions saw him collapse. A brother, Walter, 19, and a cousin, Jack Klement, 21, carried him to shore, where another brother, George, also a lifeguard, applied artificial respiration. Officers were summoned with oxygen equipment.

Vopal was a student in the commerce department at the University of Wisconsin and had one semester of his course to complete. He rowed on the Wisconsin crew for two years. He lived with his parents, Mr. and Mrs. James F. Vopalsky.

Funeral services are scheduled Aug 6.

Nazis Impose New Restrictions Upon Jewish Physicians

Berlin. — (AP) — Approximately 6,000 to 7,000 Jewish physicians in Germany have been forbidden to practice after September 30.

The only exceptions to the sweeping decree last night in the official Gazette were unusual cases wherein the interior minister can grant licenses to practice until further notice and certain World War veterans who may be given maintenance grants.

The ban will close one chapter of the systematic drive which began December 29, 1937, when 3,000 of 4,200 Jewish doctors in Germany (without subsequently annexed Austria) were dropped from staffs of private insurance companies.

Owen, medical director of Sunnyview sanatorium, Oshkosh; Dr. Oscar Lotz, Milwaukee, of the staff of the Wisconsin Anti-Tuberculosis association, and Dr. H. H. Christensen, Wausau.
