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Suggests Plan for Treatment of Mild Cases of Insanity

Madison, Wis., Aug. 3—(AP)—Dr. W. F. Lorenz, Madison psychiatrist, laid before Governor La Follette's executive council today a plan by which he said Wisconsin insane asylums may eventually be emptied of at least half their patients.

He suggested that the recently formed department of mental hygiene attempt to work out a cooperative program with counties operating asylums.

Dr. Lorenz told the council "at least 50 per cent of insanity cases on which the causes are known can be prevented by rational methods."

The plan would have counties develop existing asylums into receiving hospitals. Grant M. Haas, director of the mental hygiene department is supporting the plan.

Dr. Lorenz told the council "insanity is an accident or an illness that can affect anyone, and earlier care and good treatment can cure many cases."

TWO SCHOOLMA'AMS

SAIL 666 MILES DOWN COLORADO

Boulder City, Nev., Aug. 3—(AP)—Two Michigan schoolma'ams, who sailed 666 miles down the treacherous Colorado river past rapids and whirlpools, patted their copper-tanned cheeks with a powder puff today and ordered a victory dinner of "attlesnake steak."

The only women in history to complete the perilous voyage from Green River, Utah to Boulder Dam, Elizade Clover, 40-year-old University of Michigan botanist, and her assistant Lois Jetter, 25, arrived here with five men companions last night.

They came in three small, motorless boats—like Christopher Columbus-towed gently on the placid surface of Lake Mead by a launch after 43 days in the jagged gorges of the Colorado.

In command was Norman D. Nevils, veteran riverman of Mexican Hat, Utah.

With him and the two women were Wilbur C. Gibson, San Francisco photographer, only other member of the expedition to make the entire journey, Emeiv Kolb, Del Reed and Loren Bell who joined up at Lee's Ferry, the half-way point.

There was no definite explanation why two male members of the expedition withdrew at Lee's Ferry.

"It has been more successful than we dreamed it would be," Dr. Clover exclaimed. "Two hitherto unknown species of cacti were discovered and we found an abundance of plant life which was not known to exist along the Colorado."
